

Unicorn Square

Hook size :3mm and 4mm

Yarn: Stylecraft special dk in Candy floss, Lemon, Spring Green, Sherbet, and Apricot.

This pattern is written in US terms

US Terminology

SC – single crochet

DC – double crochet

SLST – slip stitch

ST - stitch

MR – magic ring

CH – chain

() – indicate all stitches to be made in one stitch.

UK Terminology

Gauge is 19 stitches x 11 rows =10cm (rows of DC).

Finished Square measures 12cm x 12cm.

Block granny square use 4mm hook and CLEMATIS yarn

1. In a MR, CH5 – *counts as 1st DC and CH2*. In ring make (3DC, CH2) 3 times. 2DC and SLST into the 3rd ST of the beginning CH5 to join. (20 stitches, 4 sides of 3DC with CH2 between).
2. SLST twice into the previous round CH2 space. CH5, then 2DC in the same CH2 space. *Make 1DC in each ST around with (2DC, CH2, 2DC) in the corner space. Finish with 1DC in the last corner and SLST into the 3rd ST of the beginning CH5 to join. (36 stitches, 4 sides of 7DC with CH 2 between).
3. – 6. Repeat the above. Making 1 DC into each ST with (2DC, CH2 2DC) into each corner. (Row 6 – each side has 23DC with CH2 between).
7. SLST twice into the previous round chain, (CH1 – *counts as 1st SC*, SC, CH2 then 2SC) into the same space. SC in each ST around with (2SC, CH2, 2SC) in the corner space. Repeat along finishing with 1SC in last space then SLST into the beginning CH1. Fasten off . Sew in ends. (Each side has 27SC with CH2 between).

At the time of writing, this pattern was £1.48. This is one of the nicest unicorn patterns I have come across.

Use 3mm hook.

I used **LEMON** for the horn, star, mane and tail.

SHERBET for the mane and tail.

CANDYFLOSS for the mane and tail.

WHITE for the body, head and ears.

APRICOT for the nose and hooves.

I used black cotton to sew on the eyes and nostril details. Once you have made the unicorn, pin on to the granny square and sew on. Only go through the front of the stitches on the granny square so that they do not show through the back.
